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# INTRODUCTION

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Parents, Students, Teachers and Community,

ACHS is committed to returning to in-person, face-to-face classroom instruction and having the closest thing to a normal school year that we can have. We will work to balance the risks of spreading the virus with the intense need for students' social-emotional development, mental health, and academic growth. The development of the whole student remains our focus -- Mind, Body and Spirit!

This is a working document for Phases 4 & 5 that I am sure will be altered and adjusted over the next few weeks and months as new research and best practice becomes available. And although we must rethink practically everything, somethings we cannot prepare for and must trust that they are in God's capable and loving hands. We are not going "back" to normal, instead we are moving "forward" with intentional, researched, and proactive steps to be the best Austin we can be for everyone in our "new normal".

Throughout all we do we have our core values of *truth*, *unity*, and *love* at the center. The truth is, we are not sure what the next few months will look like. These are uncharted waters. And the scientists across the world, while seeking the truth to this complex virus, have revealed some knowledge that we can all follow. In wearing masks – which let's face it, no one enjoys – we are respecting and working for the common good – for our fellow brothers and sisters. Which is directly connected to our values of love and unity. Our ability to put aside something uncomfortable or for which we do not agree or understand, for the love and support of our neighbor, friend, colleague is that "agape" love that is ultimate unity. For a safe return it will take 100% of our Austin family to practice healthy and safe measures.

As such we implore you to be honest and open with us. If you think you/your student has been exposed, stay home, get tested and report. If your student is feeling ill, please keep him/her home. It is ok to miss school. We are working on plans for students to "attend" classes while at home during these "absences of caution" or worse a confirmed case.

If your family or student is having reservations about attending in-person, face-to-face instruction under these guidelines, please contact us. We will discuss with you on a case by case basis, however, at this time ACHS is not developing a full distance learning option for students and families while in phase 4 or 5. If we are in phase 3 or below we will be in full distance learning.

As always, our doors are open [with appointments ☺] to discuss your fears, the plan, your student and the overall safety of us all. We are a team and a community, and through God's grace and guidance we will get through this. May God bless you and yours, may He protect us all throughout these days.

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# PHASE 4: OPERATIONS, HEALTH & SAFETY

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If Macomb County and therefore Austin is in a Phase 4 MERC District, as described in the MI Safe Start Plan, the following will be adhered to:

## Personal Protective Equipment

- All ACHS staff and students will wear facial coverings when in classrooms, except (1) during meals and (2) unless face coverings cannot be medically tolerated as documented through written and signed verification by a physician.
- Facial coverings may be homemade or disposable Phase one/basic-grade surgical masks. Disposable masks must be replaced daily, and homemade masks must be washed daily. Consider the mask part of the dress code – it should be worn properly, washed, and maintained as you would other clothing.
- To our disappointment the state Phase advisory team/taskforce has denied the use of face shields in place of masks.

## Screening Students & Staff

- Staff will conduct daily self-examinations, including a temperature check, prior to coming to work. If they exhibit any new or unusual symptoms as reported on the COVID-19 school monitoring form, they will stay home.
- ACHS will cooperate with the local public health department regarding implementing protocols for screening students and staff as they are released and updated.
- Parents and students are asked to self-screen and use honest and thoughtful consideration prior to attending in-person classes. We ask that students with fevers or who show symptoms, or believe they have been exposed recently remain home and get tested.
- Students may be required to complete a health questionnaire prior to attending in-person classes depending on recommendations by local health department.

## Arrival & Dismissal

- All staff must enter and exit through door #15 where a screening station is set up.
- All students must enter and exit through door #1 or door #4
  - Door #4 for early drop off **before** 7:00am and must report to library until 7:00am
  - Door #4 for late pick up (or waiting for sports) after 3:00pm must stay in library; exit door #4.
  - Please note: athletes entering and leaving practices after hours may use door #15.
- All students must be picked up by 4:30pm unless they are in an organized activity with staff/coach.
- Students remaining at school after hours must take all belongings from locker at conclusion of school day. Students will not be allowed to return to lockers or hang out in hallways. *(once hallways, lockers and academic areas are disinfected each afternoon/evening we would like to reduce traffic)*

## Personal Items/Shared Items

- All students are discouraged from sharing personal items (i.e. makeup, water bottles, hair-ties, food, etc.)

- Students are encouraged to bring individual water bottles with names clearly labeled. Drinking fountains in hallways and classrooms have been shut off. We have purchased a water bottle filling station for the main hallway for students and staff to use.
- All personal items brought to school should be properly labeled. (i.e. phones, lunch bags, book bags, etc.) so we may identify when lost or misplaced.
- ACHS will be limiting sharing of supplies such as writing utensils, art supplies, computer lab, etc. When sharing is essential to academic success, materials will be sanitized between use.

## Classrooms

- As noted above, students and teachers are required to wear masks while in classroom.
- ACHS is encouraging teachers to utilize outside classroom spaces to instruct and conduct lessons. Outside, students and staff have the opportunity to remove facial coverings if they remain 6ft apart.
- ACHS classrooms will be limited to 20 students and students will be spaced as far apart as feasible.
- When table groups are not necessary for instruction, desks and tables will be in traditional rows with all seats facing forward to limit direct face to face seating.
- We encourage staff to keep doors and windows open to improve fresh air flow. We are blessed to have large windows that open in all classrooms.
- Choir will be taking a semester hiatus.
- Band will practice outside as much as possible as masks may be removed. When weather hinders such activity, Mrs. Howell will work on sight reading, handbells, and other essential musical tasks.

## Hallways/Transitions

- Students will still be assigned two lockers (upper and lower). Students are encouraged to use locks and lock personal belongings in lockers. Personal belongings are not to be on floors or tops of lockers.
- One set of empty lockers will be between assigned lockers to space students out. All unassigned lockers will be secured to limit/reduce the expansion of student belongings into empty lockers.
- Students will be encouraged to follow driving patterns in the hallways and reduce congregating at lockers. There will be an increased presence of staff in hallways to monitor students.
- Students will be reminded verbally and with signage to not congregate or “hangout” in the restroom.

## Lunchtime

- Markers are placed where lunch line formation is anticipated at six foot intervals.
- Additional tables have been purchased for added seating in cafeteria. Additional picnic tables have been purchased for outdoor seating. Students will be allowed to eat outdoors in good weather in multiple locations. In inclement weather, tables will be open in gym, library, and cafeteria. Limited chairs and signage will be used to space students.
- Serving and cafeteria staff will use barrier protection including gloves, face shields, and surgical masks.
- Microwaves will be available but relocated to reduce line ups.
- Students are encouraged to bring bag lunches.
- As always, no lunch service will occur in August. Lunch service will begin in September and will not be “serving line style” and instead be pre-plated/pre-packaged. It is very important to pre-order as day of purchases will be significantly limited.
- During this phase, students will not be allowed to order from door dash or other delivery services. Parents delivering “forgotten” lunches to students will be allowed to enter vestibule and leave on bench (please have student’s name on lunch).

## Assemblies/Mass/Community Events

- Per guidance by Return to School plans and the AOD, ACHS will not conduct indoor assemblies that bring together students from more than one classroom.
- ACHS will continue to plan for mini retreats, small events, and assemblies that are integral to our curriculum and student life for outdoors so long as weather cooperates for our small student body and remain within current executive order number for groups.
- Guest presenters will be restricted.
- We will continue to provide Masses to students and staff and will follow all AOD Mass guidelines as published.
  - Tuesday and Thursday Masses will be one half of student population each day. The other half will participate in other spiritual activities such as prayer and mindfulness, rosary, etc. with our Campus Ministry team.
  - Friday Masses or special Masses will be held in cafeteria or outdoors where we can maintain social distancing.
- In phase 4, all large scale ACHS community events will be postponed that involve attendance numbers at or above the governor's social distancing orders/limits.

## Off Campus Programs [exiting and re-entry]

- Students attending programs off campus [Pankow Center or dual enrollment at Macomb Community College] will follow these additional procedures:
  - Students will be asked to complete a self-check and monitoring form each day
  - Students will be asked to wash/sanitize hands upon entering/re-entering from off campus
  - Those students who change clothing before leaving or upon returning are asked to do so in the front hallway restrooms so they may be cleaned and monitored.
- We will work closely with administration and directors at both locations to protect the health and safety for our students at these locations.

## Visitors/Early Dismissal/Delivering Items for Students

- Visitors to ACHS will be restricted to essential personnel, unless there is a reason for their attendance. Family members or other non-staff adults are not allowed in the school building except under extenuating circumstances determined by school officials.
- All visitors entering the building will be screened for symptoms using a monitoring form, wear a facial covering, and wash/sanitize hands prior to entering. Strict records, including date and time, will be kept of all visitors entering and exiting the building.
- Parents wishing to meet with teachers or administrators must schedule an appointment in advance.
- If parents or family members are dropping off student items during the school day (forgotten lunches, needed item left at home) they may enter vestibule upon buzzing in and leave on the bench.
- Students being released early to parents [or those on approved pick up list] will remain in class until person arrives. Upon arrival parent or approved driver will buzz in. For new parents or non-parent approved drivers, we will ask to see your identification. Office staff will complete the sign out on the appropriate form for records.

## General Operating / Hygiene

- Signage is posted throughout building to indicate proper social distancing and healthy habits.
- Social distancing markers in waiting and reception areas.

- We have adequate supplies to support healthy hygiene behaviors (including soap, hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol for safe use by staff and students, paper towels, tissues, and signs reinforcing proper handwashing techniques).
- Signs with common Catholic prayers are in restrooms and near sinks to reinforce proper 20 second handwashing and our prayers. ☺
- Staff have created a fun video to remind students on proper hygiene and etiquette for coughing, sneezing, using tissues, etc. and importance of all of us working to protect the health of one another (think core values here!)
- Soap and hand sanitizers will be checked nightly for filling.
- All classrooms, offices, and common areas will have hand sanitizer. Most classrooms all have sinks with soap and paper towel.

## Cleaning

- ACHS is deeply cleaned at the start and end of each school year including carpets, air filters, windows, etc.
- ACHS has increased our cleaning schedule for nightly disinfecting
- Student desks will be wiped down with an EPA-approved disinfectant after every block/when cohorts change.
- Frequently touched surfaces including light switches, doors, benches, bathrooms, will undergo cleaning at least every four hours with an EPA-approved disinfectant.
- Libraries, computer labs, arts, and other hands-on classrooms will undergo cleaning at the conclusion of every block with an EPA-approved disinfectant.
- Each classroom will store cleaning and disinfection products/supplies safely under the sink or in a marked cabinet.
- Staff will wear proper personal protection equipment (i.e. gloves, surgical masks, and face shields) when performing all cleaning activities.
- Areas where a symptomatic individual was present, will be closed and intensely cleaned and sanitized.

## Responding To Positive Cases or Symptomatic Students/Staff And Testing Protocols

- Symptomatic students and staff will be kept home until they have tested negative for COVID-19 or have been released from isolation/completely recovered according to CDC guidelines.
- Families will be notified of the presence of any laboratory positive or clinically diagnosed cases of COVID-19 in the classroom and/or school to encourage closer observation for any symptoms at home.
- Students and staff who become ill with signs or symptoms of COVID-19 while at school will be placed in the “clinic area” located in the main office with a facial covering in place, if able, until they can be picked up. Mrs Coppens or Mr. Baker will care for these children/staff while wearing a mask and face shield. Door will remain closed with shades up for monitoring of person.
- ACHS will cooperate with the local public health department regarding implementing protocols for screening students and staff.
- ACHS will communicate and work directly with Macomb County Health Department if a confirmed case of COVID-19 is identified, and in particular, collect the contact information for any close contacts of the affected individual from two days before he or she showed symptoms to the time when he or she was last present at the school. It is the Local Health Department that will initiate contact tracing, following regular public health practice.
- In the event of a confirmed case of COVID-19, ACHS will follow Health Department and CDC guidelines for the suspension of classes, access to building, and cleaning
- ACHS will notify local health officials, staff, and students immediately of any possible case of COVID-19 while maintaining confidentiality consistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), FERPA, and other applicable federal and state privacy laws.

**Please note:** we will always communicate directly with you in a timely and swift manner appropriate for the situation and as directed by health officials. Please do not escalate an already unpredictable situation by perpetuating rumors. Just because a student leaves school early or is sick does not mean he/she has COVID. As such just because a person is absent for multiple days does not mean he/she is sick or has COVID. In addition, per privacy laws we will release as much information as we can while protecting the rights of individuals in accordance with the law. With core values of truth, unity, and love, we ask that we all – staff, parents, and students keep these in mind.

## Athletics & Extra Curricular Activities

- ACHS will follow all Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) and the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) guidelines as updated and released. Due to changing policies please refer to the following link with the most up-to-date information:

- All clubs and extra-curricular activities will follow the above protocol for space, safety, hygiene and social distancing.

## Student Transportation in School Vehicles

- ACHS will be suspending transportation in school vehicles during Phase 4.

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# PHASE 4: INSTRUCTIONAL PLANS

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## Instructional Options

- In Phase 4, ACHS will return to in person instruction with a modified calendar (see schedule below).
- We are preparing distance learning policies and procedures for individual students and scenarios for when students are symptomatic, are asymptomatic but tested positive, are sick and unsure, have been exposed and are unsure of coming to school, and/or have other documented reasons for not attending in person classes to provide instruction.
- If your family or student is having reservations about attending in-person, face-to-face instruction under the above guidelines, please contact us. **We will discuss with you on a case by case basis, however, at this time ACHS is not developing a full distance learning option for students and families while in Phase 4.** If we are in Phase 3 or below, due to increased cases in our area or state or have a reason to close the building, we will be in full distance learning.

## School Calendar/Schedule:

- Adjustments have been made to the academic calendar to provide for phased return of students in smaller groups during week 1. Otherwise a normal block schedule will be followed.
- Accelerated schedule Fridays have been removed during Phase 4. All Fridays while in Phase 4 will be distance learning Fridays OR teacher work days. The distance learning schedule for Fridays will follow a

modified block schedule (Mass in middle of day) and will alternate between Mon/Wed and Tue/Thur for those Fridays. *Please refer to calendar for specific schedule.*

- Seminar will continue as normal with large classes reporting to library or cafeteria.
- House time will be scheduled for students and staff during the day as appropriate.
- As noted above, Masses will be scheduled with reduced student body attendance.

## Spiritual, Mental & Social-Emotional

- Staff continues to receive timely, responsive, and ongoing training/professional development for spiritual, mental & social-emotional health and growth of students.
- With both a school counselor on staff and a full-time deacon there is always someone the students have access to for their spiritual, mental and social-emotional health.
- Mr Juday is the point person for facilitating mental health referrals, communications to families/ students, and public-facing wellness materials.
- Service opportunities will still be promoted and shared with students and families as there are still many options out in our communities.

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# PHASE 5: OPERATIONS, HEALTH & SAFETY

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*If Macomb County and therefore Austin is in a Phase 5 MERC District, as described in the MI Safe Start Plan, the following will be adhered to:*

## Personal Protective Equipment

- Face coverings are optional for students and staff when in classrooms. If a staff member or student has been identified to be at increased risk of illness by their physician, face coverings should be worn.
- All staff and students will wear facial coverings in hallways and common areas, except (1) during meals and (2) unless face coverings cannot be medically tolerated as documented through written and signed verification by a physician for staff, or with parental consent for students.
- Facial coverings may be homemade or disposable Phase one/basic-grade surgical masks. Disposable masks must be replaced daily, and homemade masks must be washed daily.

## Screening Students & Staff

- Staff will conduct daily self-examinations, including a temperature check, prior to coming to work. If they exhibit any new or unusual symptoms as reported on the COVID-19 school monitoring form, they will stay home.
- ACHS will cooperate with the local public health department regarding implementing protocols for screening students and staff as they are released and updated.
- Students may be required to complete a health questionnaire prior to attending in-person classes depending on recommendations by local health department.
- Parents and students are asked to self-screen and use honest and thoughtful consideration prior to attending in-person classes. We ask that students with fevers or who show symptoms remain home.

## Arrival & Dismissal

- All staff must enter and exit through door #15 where a screening station is set up.
- All students must enter and exit through door #1 or door #4
  - Door #4 for early drop off before 7:00am and must report to library until 7:00am
  - Door #4 for late pick up (or waiting for sports) after 3:00pm must stay in library and exit door #4.
  - Please note: athletes entering and leaving practices after hours may use door #15.
- All students must be picked up by 4:30pm unless they are in an organized activity with staff/coach.
- Students remaining at school after hours must take all belongings from locker at conclusion of school day. Students will not be allowed to return to lockers or hang out in hallways. *(once hallways, lockers and academic areas are disinfected each afternoon/evening we would like to reduce traffic)*

## Personal Items/Shared Items

- All students are discouraged from sharing personal items (i.e. makeup, water bottles, clothing, food, etc.)
- Students are encouraged to bring individual water bottles with names clearly labeled. Drinking fountains in hallways and classrooms have been shut off. We have purchased a water bottle filling station for the main hallway for students and staff to use.
- ACHS will continue to limit sharing of shared supplies. When sharing is essential to academic success, materials will be sanitized between use.

## Classrooms

- ACHS will continue to support teachers utilizing outside classroom spaces to instruct and conduct lessons whenever weather permits.
- ACHS classrooms will be limited to 20 students and students will be spaced as far apart as feasible. If students are working in groups or in close proximity to peers and staff, we will ask that they wear masks or face shields (i.e. science labs, art class, etc.) for everyone's safety.
- We encourage staff to keep doors and windows open to improve fresh air flow.

## Hallways/Transitions

- Students will still be assigned two lockers (upper and lower). Students are encouraged to use locks and lock personal belongings in lockers. Personal belongings are not to be on floors or tops of lockers.
- One set of empty lockers will be between assigned lockers to space students out. All unassigned lockers will be secured to limit/reduce the expansion of student belongings into empty lockers.
- Students will be monitored to limit congregating at lockers. There will be an increased presence of staff in hallways to monitor students.
- Students will be reminded verbally and with signage to not congregate or "hangout" in the restroom.

## Lunchtime

- Will continue to promote social distancing through multiple areas for eating lunch including outside and expanded indoor locations.
- Serving and cafeteria staff will use barrier protection including gloves, face shields, and surgical masks.
- Microwaves will be available but relocated to reduce line ups.
- In Phase 5 we will still restrict ordering from door dash or other delivery services.

## Assemblies/Mass/Community Events

- Per guidance by Return to School plans and the AOD, ACHS will not conduct indoor assemblies that bring together more students than the most recent Executive Order allows. Under the order we will continue to plan for mini retreats, small events, and assemblies that are integral to our curriculum and student life for outdoors or within the allotted size for indoors.
- We will continue to provide Masses to students and staff and will follow all AOD Mass guidelines as published. Depending on policies, Mass schedule may be reduced, student attendance alternated, or location changed.
- In Phase 5, all large scale ACHS community events [indoor or outdoor] will not bring together more than the allotted persons under the most recent Executive Order.

## Off Campus Programs [exiting and re-entry]

- Students attending programs off campus during the school day [Pankow Center or dual enrollment at Macomb Community College] will continue to be monitored and our administration will keep in direct contact with administrators at both locations to protect the health and safety for our students.

## Visitors/Early Dismissal/Delivering Items for Students

- Visitors to ACHS will be restricted to essential personnel, unless there is a reason for their attendance. Family members or other non-staff adults are not allowed in the school building except under extenuating circumstances determined by school officials.

- All visitors entering the building will be screened for symptoms using a monitoring form, wear a facial covering, and wash/sanitize hands prior to entering. Strict records, including date and time, will be kept of all visitors entering and exiting the building.
- Parents wishing to meet with teachers or administrators must schedule an appointment in advance.
- If parents or family members are dropping off student items during the school day (forgotten lunches, needed item left at home) they may enter vestibule upon buzzing in and leave on the bench.

- In the event of a confirmed case of COVID-19, ACHS will follow Health Department and CDC guidelines for the suspension of classes, access to building, cleaning, and at worst temporary closing of school.
- ACHS will notify local health officials, staff, and students immediately of any possible case of COVID-19 while maintaining confidentiality consistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and other applicable federal and state privacy laws.

## Athletics & Extra Curricular Activities

- ACHS will follow all Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) and the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) guidelines as updated and released. Due to changing policies please refer to the following link with the most up-to-date information:

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# PHASE 5: INSTRUCTIONAL PLANS

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## Instructional Options

- In Phase 5, ACHS will continue in person instruction with a modified calendar for Fridays.
- Distance learning policies and procedures will be in place for individual students and scenarios for when students are symptomatic, are asymptomatic but tested positive, are sick and unsure, have been exposed and are unsure of coming to school, and/or have other documented reasons for not attending in person classes to provide instruction.
- As with Phase 4, ACHS will discuss options with your family on a case by case basis, **however, we will not be developing a full distance learning option for students and families while in Phase 5.**

## School Calendar/Schedule:

- Fridays **will return to in-person** following a modified block schedule (Mass in middle of day) and will alternate between Mon/Wed and Tue/Thur. We will still not hold accelerated schedule Fridays during Phase 5. Many Fridays will be teacher days with no instruction. *Please refer to calendar for specific schedule.*

## Spiritual, Mental & Social-Emotional

- Staff continues to receive timely, responsive, and ongoing training/professional development for spiritual, mental & social-emotional health and growth of students.
- With both a school counselor on staff and a full-time deacon there is always someone the students have access to for their spiritual, mental and social-emotional health.
- Mr Juday is the point person for facilitating mental health referrals, communications to families/ students, and public-facing wellness materials.
- Service opportunities will still be promoted and shared and we anticipate in Phase 5 more locations to allow volunteers.
